



Dear Friends,

From the earliest period of the church's history, Christians have used the days leading up to Easter as a time of penitence, fasting, and prayer. Originally, the forty-day season of Lent, which developed perhaps as early as the fourth century, provided a time in which coverts to the faith were prepared for baptism into the body of Christ. It was also a time in which those who found themselves separated from the community of faith were reconciled and restored to the fellowship of the church.

This two-fold focus of Lent is a good place to start as we consider our own Lenten observance. The days and weeks leading up to Easter can be a time for us to examine our own lives, to seek opportunities to deepen and grow our faith, and to remember and renew our own baptismal vows. We can do this by being intentional in our worship habits and by setting aside time each day for prayer, study and reflection.

Lent can also be a time in which we can seek reconciliation – with God and with one another. Are there relationships in our lives that are broken or need attention? Are there past wrongs that need to be righted? Are there old habits or unhealthy practices that can be "given up"? The season of Lent provides us with an opportunity to seek and share the gifts of forgiveness and wholeness.

And just as we do not celebrate Advent without remembering Christmas, so we do not celebrate Lent as though we know nothing about Easter. All of our Lenten observances and practices are carried out in light of the grace and love demonstrated to us in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ our Lord which is not only at culmination of our Lenten journey, but is at the center of all that we believe as Christians.

May the season of Lent be a time in which we are all reminded of the love and grace and mercy we find in Jesus Christ as we seek to be his faithful disciples.

AFFORDABLE & ATTAINABLE HOUSING CAMPAIGN UPDATES

Our campaign for affordable and attainable housing remains strong, and we have several key updates and upcoming events to share with you.

SPLOST-8 Advocacy Efforts

We continue working to ensure affordable housing is a priority in the upcoming SPLOST-8 referendum. Here's where we stand:

CITY ADVOCACY

- The Affordable Housing Committee recently met with officials from the City of Savannah and Chatham County to advocate for the inclusion of affordable housing in SPLOST-8.
- In our meeting with Jay Melder, Savannah's City Manager, we successfully secured his commitment to recommending a minimum of \$20 million towards affordable housing in the city's budget priorities. The city must release the referendum project list 90 days before the vote, and we will keep you informed.

COUNTY ADVOCACY

- We also met with Chatham County Chairman Chester Ellis and County Manager Michael Kaigler, who expressed commitment to working with all municipalities and contributing to inclusive housing projects. However, they have yet to specify a specific budget allocation. As with the city, the county is required to release its budget and project list 90 days before the referendum.
- Next Steps: We urge you to stay engaged and review the referendum project recommendations once released. We advocate for supporting SPLOST-8 only if it includes robust funding for affordable & inclusive housing.

The JUST Affordable Housing Committee will speak in support of Bria Paxton's proposed Zoning Text Amendment. Your presence at this meeting is crucial, as this amendment is essential to promoting affordable housing.

HERE'S WHY WE SUPPORT IT:

- Equitable Growth: Zoning has historically excluded lower-income communities and people of color. This amendment ensures zoning works for everyone.
- Density Bonus: The proposal incentivizes small-scale, "missing middle" housing like duplexes, triplexes, and small apartments, increasing affordable housing availability.
- Neighborhood Diversity: It promotes scattered-site affordable housing while preserving neighborhood character.
- Affordable Living for All:


